

18. List three comparisons between disciples and fisherman. Answers may include patience, perseverance, courage, having an eye for movement, using the right bait, and staying out of sight.

B. Short Answers

1. Why does God's story begin with creation? This shows that God was in control from the very beginning and that, already then, he had a plan for the world.
2. Make five comparisons between the old and new covenants. Answers will vary but may include the following: old—many high priests; new—Jesus Christ as the only high priest; old—many sacrifices; new—one sacrifice; old—tabernacle/ temple as the center of worship; new—our hearts the center of worship; old—covenant between God and Abram/the Jews; new—covenant between God and all nations; old—dependent upon works; new—dependent only upon Christ's sacrifice.
3. List the three temptations of Jesus. To turn stones into bread, to jump from the temple pinnacle, and to bow down and worship Satan.
4. How did Jesus show that he was fully human and fully divine? He showed that he was human by becoming hungry and tired, being tempted, giving vent to emotions, and dying. He showed that he was divine by resisting all temptation and by rising from the dead.
